Day One: Seattle-Coombs Old Country Market-Port Alberni

Let's head to see the wilds of Vancouver
Island. We'll begin with a scenic ferry ride to
Nanaimo BC. Tour Coombs Old Country
Market- home to the roof top goats.

From Parksville, Highway 4 cuts due west,
climbing up over the mountainous spine of
Vancouver Island before dropping into Port
Alberni, at the head of the Pacific's Alberni
Inlet. Tonight, we will transport you to
Chances Rim Rock Casino for dinner in the
Cypress Dining Room. From towering cedars
to massive Douglas Firs, enjoy a 25,000 sq ft
Pacific Rainforest themed gaming center.

Day Two: Broken Island Cruise

You are about to spend a day much as you
might have done over 60 years ago, when the
Lady Rose was a baby and the principal means
of transportation along the B.C. coast was by
ships and crew similar to today's Lady Rose
and Frances Barkley. These ships emulate the
slower pace of life of yesteryear and you'll
have plenty of time to look for wildlife and
enjoy the scenery as well as make the
acquaintance of your fellow passengers

through the waters of the Broken Group
Islands spotting eagles, seals, sea lions and a
variety of marine birds. You are invited to
share your experiences with the ship's crew
when they are not engaged in landing at a
wharf of float, or loading/unloading freight.
So bring your binoculars, and camera and
film, a warm jacket and casual clothes (these
are working packet freighters) and thoroughly
enjoy your day.

Day Three: Port Alberni Steam Train & Vaudeville Show

You can board the train pulled by our
completely restored 1929 Baldwin ex-logging
locomotive at the 1912 CPR Station and ride
out to the McLean Mill National Historic Site.
The track winds through the City of Port
Alberni and then the surrounding forests for
35 minutes each way. You and your guests
will discover British Columbia's forest
legacy, with an authentic and unique snapshot
of the past including steam-powered
machinery, rustic buildings, and a beautiful
forest setting. The Tin Pants Theatre
Company is the McLean Mill National
Historic Site's resident troupe of interpretive
actors, who make history come alive with
guided tours around the site, original stage
shows, visiting with the Mill's visitors, and
their many acting, singing, dancing, &

Day Four: North Island Wildlife Recovery Center and World Parrot Refuge

North Island Wildlife Recovery Centre, which takes in injured and orphaned wildlife, with the goal of returning them to the wild. The tour includes the Museum of Nature, with hands-on exhibits and a nature walk through a waterfall; the Eagle Flight cage (Canada's largest), where eagles can be viewed through one-way glass; an extensive public viewing area that houses the non-releasable wildlife; and a nature trail around the center's release pond, showing B.C.'s flora. In addition the "Wildlife Learning Centre" offers live animal presentations. Next, see our feathered friends at the World Parrot Refuge home to over 700 colorful parrots. After we'll head to the ferry for our journey back to Seattle. Welcome home!
